

Extended CPE: 5th Feb – 3rd Dec 2018

The Clinical Pastoral Education unit will run from 5th Feb to 3rd December 2018 with breaks for public holidays, and for the Victorian government school holidays in April, July and September. The program is based on a relaxed rather than intense scheduling. Participants will be required to attend 32 of the 35 Monday education program days and will be assessed on their ability to participate sensitively in seminars and group discussion. Participants are required to also attend an additional day each week on a day negotiated with the Centre Director to complete their major clinical placement as a Pastoral Care Assistant in one of the Banyule congregations, a minor placement in the Network Coffee Shop and preach one seven minute sermon in a congregational setting.

Apply by 14th November 2018

Interviews will be scheduled for Friday 23rd November to select four participants. If there are vacancies later applications may be considered on inquiry up to 16th January 2019.

Cost

The ASACPEV Inc. recommended fee for a CPE unit in 2019 is \$1714. Some scholarship and bursary assistance can be explored with the Centre Director.

Accreditation of CPE

On successful completion of the unit, participants will receive a Certificate issued by ASACPEV Inc. and signed by the Centre Director. A Clinical Pastoral Education program can be credited as a subject of a number of awards with teaching institutions associated with the *University of Divinity*, the *Australian College of Theology*, and other bodies. CPE participants seeking such credit should consult with the relevant teaching institution.

University of Divinity Credit

Should this CPE Unit be claimed for a college degree credit with the University of Divinity, the tuition fee will be that set by the University of Divinity. Credit for University of Divinity Awards: Since January 2015 **credit is only granted if the candidate has enrolled in the relevant Unit: DP8273S or CPE Level 1 or DP9273S or CPE Level 2.**

Enrolment in these units is dependent on:

1. completion of the University of Divinity prerequisites;
2. receipt of a letter offering a place in a registered CPE Centre.

If part of a theological qualification through a higher education provider FEE-HELP may be available.

Ministry of Pastoral Care Practice

Each member of the course will offer pastoral care to a congregation within the Banyule Network of Uniting Churches. In this environment, they will have the opportunity to experience the pastoral and professional identity of being a Pastoral Care Assistant.

Why this Clinical setting?

In 2019 participants in the Banyule Network of Uniting Churches CPE Centre programme will:-

- 1 Complete the final year of a triennial contract of Supervised Pastoral Care to church families in a time when properties have been closed and sold, ministry appointments have been made redundant and the inauguration a new ministry team is in progress.
- 2 Study with a Centre Director who during 2019 will celebrate 50 years of involvement in CPE, first at Austin Health, then as a Supervisor at large and finally as Centre Director of the Banyule Network of Uniting Churches CPE Centre
- 3 Provide pastoral care to Church members during experiences of community and individual transition.
- 4 Integrate their personal experiences of transition into their ministry to others experiencing transition.

CPE Education Day Components

Seminars

The program will commence with a three day Induction program. There will also be some hours of teaching of concepts and theories over the life of the CPE Unit. Over the 35 week program the Centre will engage CPE supervisors like Tom Rose, Carina Lobo and others with Pastoral Care & Mental Health Education to provide leadership of creative seminars. This CPE Unit provides approximately 55 hours of seminar presentations where each member of the CPE group presents to their peers written reports of actual pastoral care, the story of their spiritual formation, a longitudinal case study, a video of a seven minute sermon presentation as well as their course goals, mid year and end of year evaluations.

Group

In addition, the education days in this program include 29 one hour Group Meetings led by the Centre Director and Consultant.



Individual Supervision & Consultation


The primary educational resource in this CPE Unit is the provision of regular individual supervision throughout the CPE program. An experienced supervisor educated and accredited through the Association for Supervised and Clinical Pastoral Education in Victoria Inc. (ASACPEV Inc.) will provide this supervision. In addition a consultant will provide individual sessions of consultancy in order to assist participants plan their work, develop strategies for approaching members as a Pastoral Care Assistant in a congregation and Network programmes.

Written Assignments

During the CPE Unit each participant will be required to present the following for supervision in a structured seminar:

- five reminiscence reports of pastoral conversation;
- a coffee shop observation report;
- course goals
- a seven minute sermon presented in one of the Churches
- one longitudinal case study;
- a personal spirituality life story;
- a mid year and final year evaluation.

When meeting individually with a supervisor, each participant will provide an evaluative journal of their CPE education day with a focus on an ongoing evaluation of their relationship with their supervisor and their engagement with any encounter in their pastoral care that disturbs their peace and sleep.
